Some of you may remember the ad “Calgon take me away”, well, you can be taken away from it all when you join us July 18-24, 2010 in Colorado Springs for the annual CACI convention. Not only is it the yearly gathering, it is a very special gathering, the 50th Anniversary of CACI. We have planned our 50th in the very same city where the 1st convention was held. We are staying at the Crowne Plaza Hotel located just south of downtown not far from the airport. This is our base of operations for the week but we will be offering tours of the surrounding area daily.

Colorado Springs is located at the base of Pikes Peak so we are surrounded by beautiful mountains, luscious scenery and fresh mountain air, taking us away from the noise of everyday life and into a world of nature's tranquil sounds. We will witness



Mother Nature's splendor that she created millions of years ago. Not just the Rocky Mountains with the 14,110 foot summit of Pikes Peak reached by the Cog, the highest railroad in the United States, but, also the awesome power of tectonic plates and erosion which is Garden of the Gods. Not to be missed is the Air Force Academy with the magnificent Cadet Chapel with it's architecture soaring skyward. On the free day a tour is offered to visit the Royal Gorge and Park and take in the view from the Royal Gorge bridge suspended 1,053 feet above the roaring Arkansas River. The park features the longest single-span Aerial Tram, steepest incline Railway and the most incredible quarter-mile journey through the clouds. Also featured on this tour is a visit to the Holy Cross Abbey Winery with tasting included. The winery has been attracting visitors from all over the world located on the pastoral and serene grounds of the Holy Cross Abbey. This tour includes the Royal Gorge, lunch and the wine tasting.

Our offsite night will be spent visiting the Flying W Ranch, a taste of the Old West. The Flying W Ranch is a true-to-life working ranch where you can get a genuine feel for the food, traditions, and lifestyle of legendary cowboys. We will enjoy a Chuck wagon dinner under the stars, see historic sites and get the chance to stomp our feet to the down-home music of the legendary Flying W Wranglers.

These are just the highlights of a week spent in Faith, Fun and Friendship. It is a six day convention with the cost not increasing from last year at a reasonable \$849 early bird, \$874 for the next deadline and \$899 until June 1. We are also offering a post-convention for those who plan to stay just a little while longer. On Saturday, July 24th, there is a bus tour heading to Denver for the weekend. It is a tour of Denver with lodging offered in Denver at the Crowne Plaza Hotel located near the 16th Street Shopping Mall in the heart of the city.

You can reach Colorado Springs by plane, train, bus and car. Several airlines fly into the Colorado Springs Airport and the hotel offers free transportation. Another option would be to fly into Denver and then make your way to Colorado Springs, with car rental available and there is a shuttle between them for a fee. For those wishing to attend the Post-Convention in Denver, airlines offer and “Open jaw” feature. That is where you could fly into Colorado Springs and then fly out of Denver, so check your airlines.

We hope to see you in Colorado Springs! It's not to late to come.


