Colonists and Coasters



Eastern Regional Conference Williamsburg, Virginia April 4-6, 2014

Walk along the same streets where the Founding Fathers once walked. Colonial Williamsburg, once the capital of Virginia, was the center of both government and social life of colonial Virginia. George Washington began his political career here and Thomas Jefferson attended college at the College of William and Mary.



You may also visit Jamestown Settlement, a replica of the first permanent English colony in what later became the United States. Go aboard a replica of one of the three ships that brought John Smith and the other original colonists to Virginia. Yorktown is also nearby, the site where General Washington and the Patriots defeated General Cornwallis and the Redcoats in the final major battle of the American Revolution. Visit a replica of an American army camp and learn about the hardships of camp life during the American Revolution.

For those who would like something more thrilling, spend the day riding the Griffin rollercoaster and other attractions at Busch Gardens Amusement Park. Busch Gardens will be open Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.

Accommodations

Guests will stay at **the Woodlands of Colonial Williamsburg**, a premier hotel located within one mile of Duke of Gloucester Street, the heart of Colonial Williamsburg. Guests may also choose to stay at the **Cascade Motel**, less expensive accommodations which are part of the same hotel complex. The Cascade Motel features parking adjacent to the guests' rooms. The Cascade Motel also allows pets.

Getting Here

Williamsburg is only 20 minutes from the Newport News/Williamsburg Airport and less than one hour from Richmond and Norfolk Airports. Train transportation by Amtrak is also available directly to Williamsburg. If traveling by vehicle, Williamsburg is located between Richmond and Norfolk and easily reached from Interstate-64.

Colonial Williamsburg Ghost Walk

Explore Colonial Williamsburg during a guided nighttime walking tour on Friday, April 4th at 8:30 p.m. The tour costs \$12. Sign up early because space is limited for this event.

Saturday Activities

On Saturday, guests may travel to any one of the sites within the historic triangle, Colonial Williamsburg, Yorktown, or Jamestown, or to Busch Gardens. A shuttle service is provided to each from the Woodlands Hotel.

Discount Tickets

The Woodlands provides a discount ticket to Colonial Williamsburg for all guests staying at the hotel. Guests will pay only \$19, less than half of the regular admission price.

Note that discount tickets are not currently available to other area attractions. Guests will need to purchase these on their own.
